Al for Language Education: New Opportunities and Challenges

Professor ZHU Tianqing is Professor and Vice Dean (Research) in the faculty of Data Science at the City University of Macau. She holds B.Eng. and M.Eng. degrees from Wuhan University, Wuhan, China and a PhD in Computer Science from Deakin University, Australia. Prior to that, she was a Professor at the China University of Geosciences (Wuhan). Professor Zhu will explore the transformative potential of AI in language education, including personalised learning and democratized access to resources, while also addressing challenges like data privacy, ethical implications, and cultural sensitivity. It aims to foster a balanced understanding of AI's role in shaping future educational strategies, considering both opportunities and obstacles.

The Role of AI in Revolutionizing Language Learning and Teaching

Professor David Nunan is Professor Emeritus of Applied Linguistics at the University of Hong Kong; President Emeritus and Distinguished Research Professor at Anaheim University, where he also served as President; and Senior Trustee at TIRF (The International Research Foundation for English Language Education). Professor Nunan will argue that generative AI (GenAI) presents significant opportunities for enhancing education, enabling the development of higher-order thinking, creativity, collaboration, reflection, and independent learning among students. However, achieving these benefits requires a shift in teachers' attitudes and practices, and it necessitates rethinking assessment methods to align with the goals of education in the era of AI.





Al Powering Learning-Driven Concordancing for Academic Writing

Professor LI Wenzhong is a doctoral supervisor at Zhejiang Gongshang University. He earned his PhD in Corpus Linguistics at Shanghai Jiaotong University and his Post-Graduate Diploma in English Language Teaching at the National Institute of Education, Nanyang University of Science and Technology. One area of Dr. Li's research interests is in data science applications in corpus linguistics. Dr. Li will explore the integration of corpus concordancing and AI technology in academic writing instruction, aiming to empower learners to independently explore language patterns and improve their writing. The approach combines this data-driven learning method with AI-generated feedback, offering learners a comprehensive understanding of academic language use and fostering more effective learning outcomes.

From Promise to Practice: Empowering Argumentative Writing with Generative AI

Dr. LENG Jing is an associate professor in the Department of Education Information Technology at the East China Normal University (ECNU) in Shanghai, China. She received her PhD at the University of Hong Kong. Her research centers on AI & language learning, computer-supported collaborative learning, and critical thinking. Dr. Leng will explore the use of generative AI, specifically ChatGPT, in enhancing university students' argumentative writing skills. She will investigate AI's role in providing feedback, fostering coherence, and promoting critical thinking through a multi-agent debate framework. Her talk aims to help language teachers leverage AI as a powerful, adaptable tool for scalable language learning solutions.

Introduction to TIRF

Since 1998, the mission of TIRF (The International Research Foundation for English Language Education) has focused on improving the global landscape of language education. Through engaging in various research-based activities, TIRF has demonstrated its continued commitment to positively influencing the lives of its stakeholders, including teachers, researchers, authors, publishers, philanthropic foundations, government agencies, and corporations. Our Trustees believe that the ultimate success in meeting the Foundation's goals will depend to a large degree on support from both individuals and groups around the world. TIRF Publications: TIRF has demonstrated a history of commissioning research on some of the most important topics in the field of language education. In 2012, TIRF entered into a publishing contract with Routledge (Taylor & Francis) to produce an international research-based series, "Global Research in Teaching and Learning English." Grant & Prize Programs: The Foundation's flagship grant opportunity – its Doctoral Dissertation Grants (DDG) program – began in 2002. Designed to provide financial support to candidates in the final stages of their doctoral studies, the DDG program has made 208 awards to individuals from nearly 30 countries. TIRF partners who have made major contributions to this program for more than two decades include the British Council, Cambridge English (part of Cambridge University Press & Assessment), Duolingo, Educational Testing Service, among others. Beyond the DDG program, TIRF offers annually the TIRF Kathleen M. Bailey Teacher-Research Award, the TIRF James E. Alatis Prize for Research on Language Policy and Planning in Educational Contexts, and the TIRF-British Council Research Mentoring Awards.

Professional Services: TIRF provides <u>various types of services</u> in the field of language education. These services include professional development opportunities for language education professionals, program review services for language education centers, TIRF Talks, conference co-hosting, and others

Board of Trustees: TIRF's Board is composed of internationally renowned, senior members in language education. The Trustees represent academic, business, and policy perspectives in our field.
