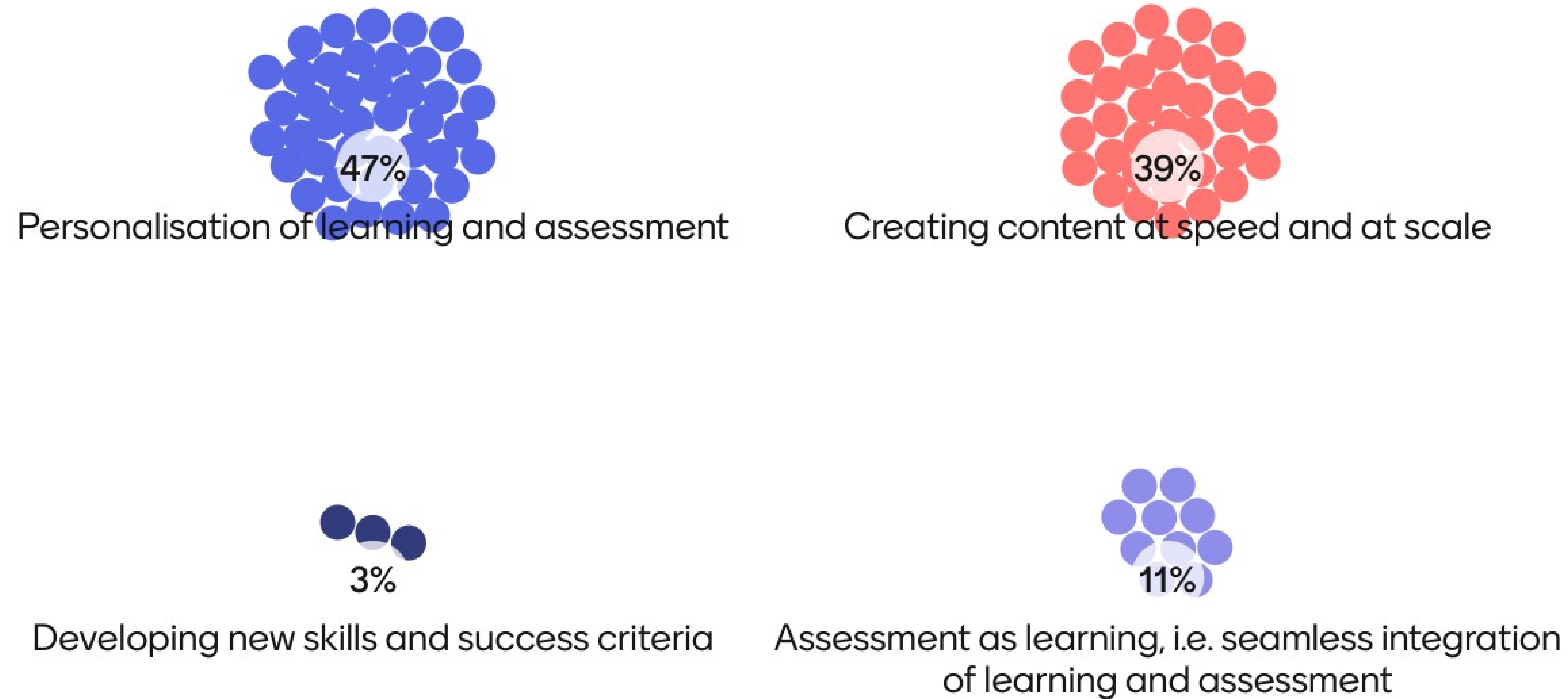
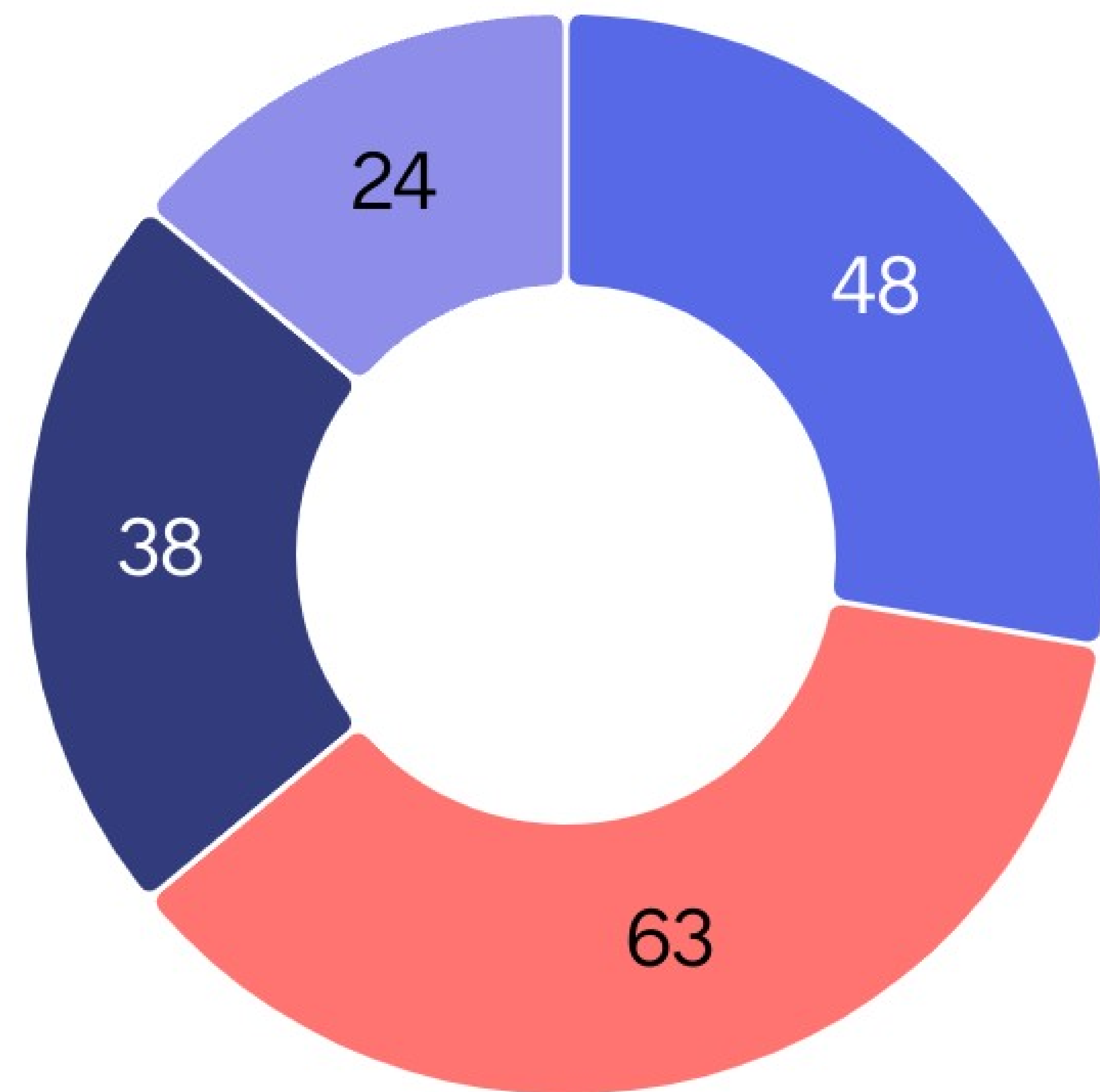

Which of these AI risks do you think pose the biggest concerns in language education?



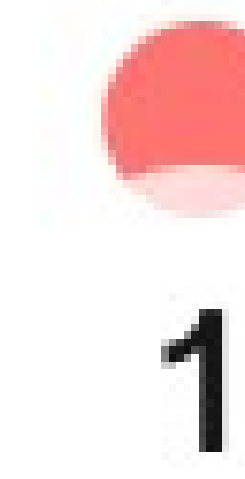

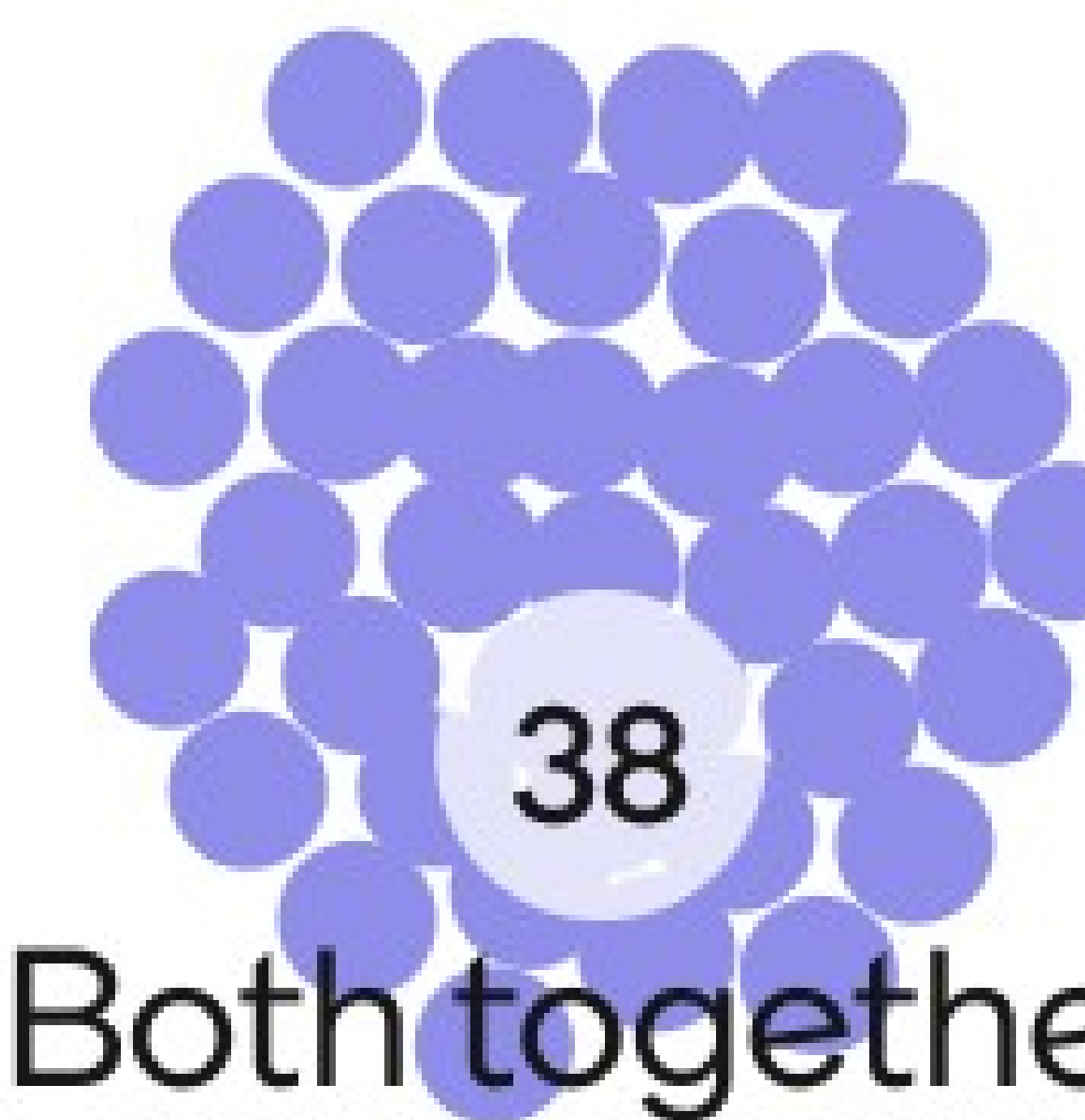

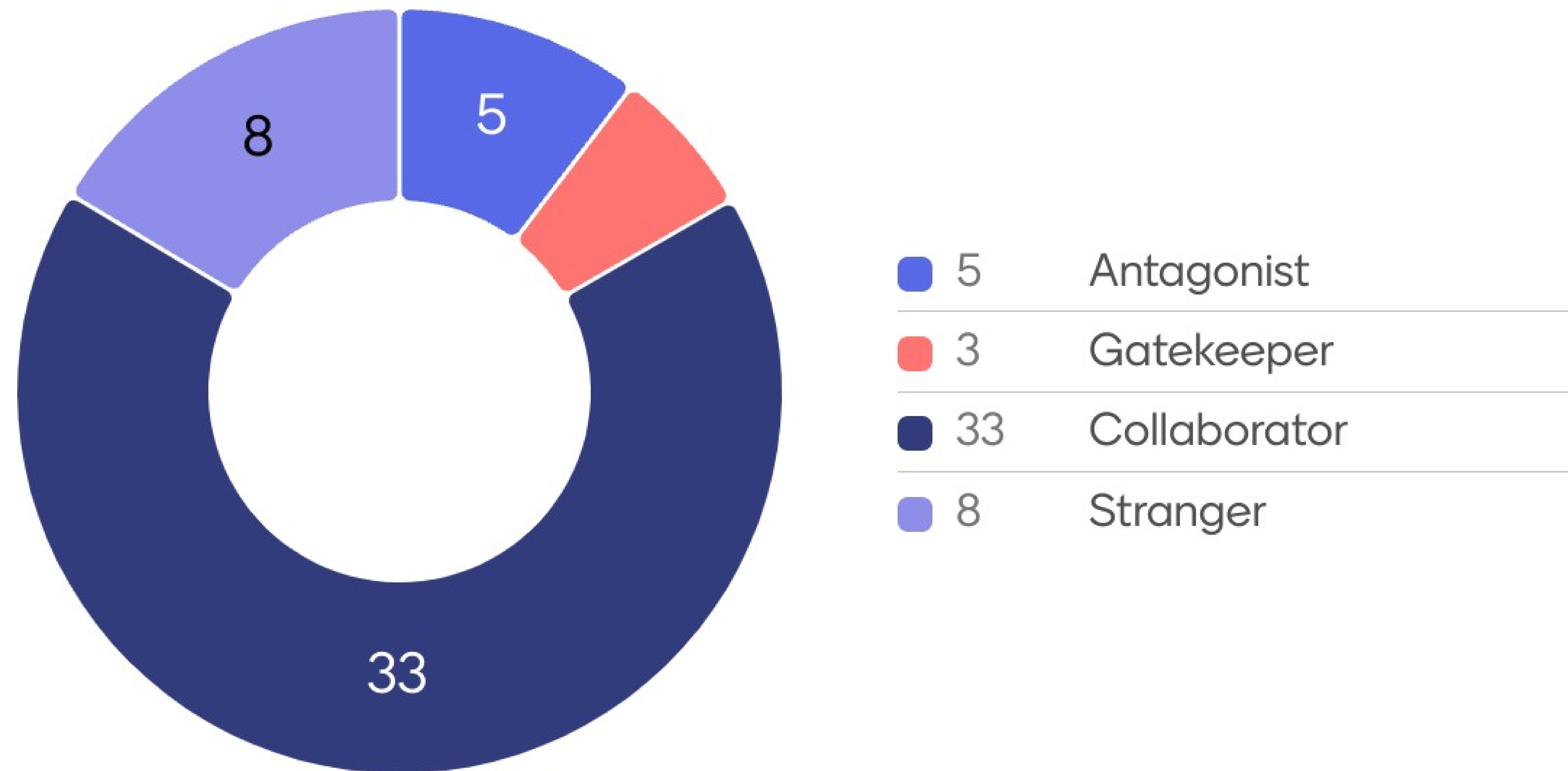

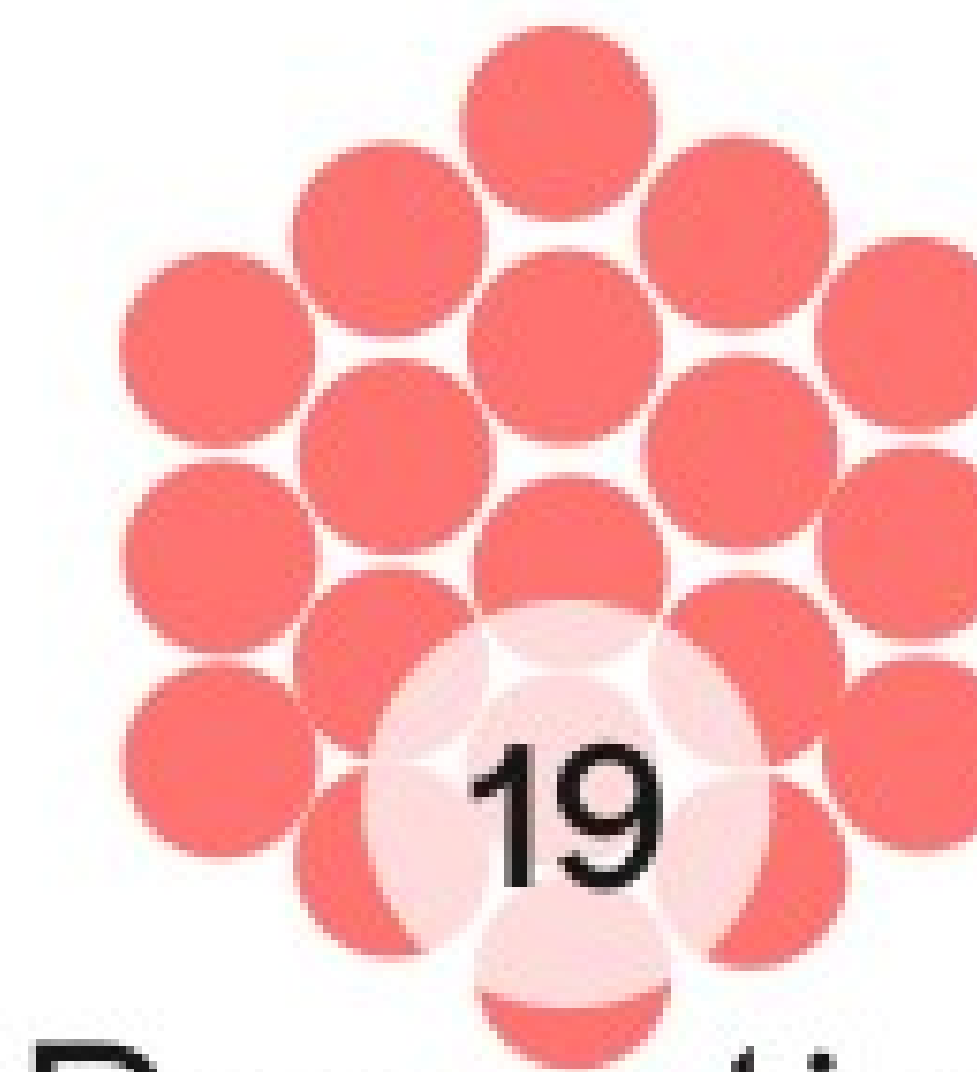





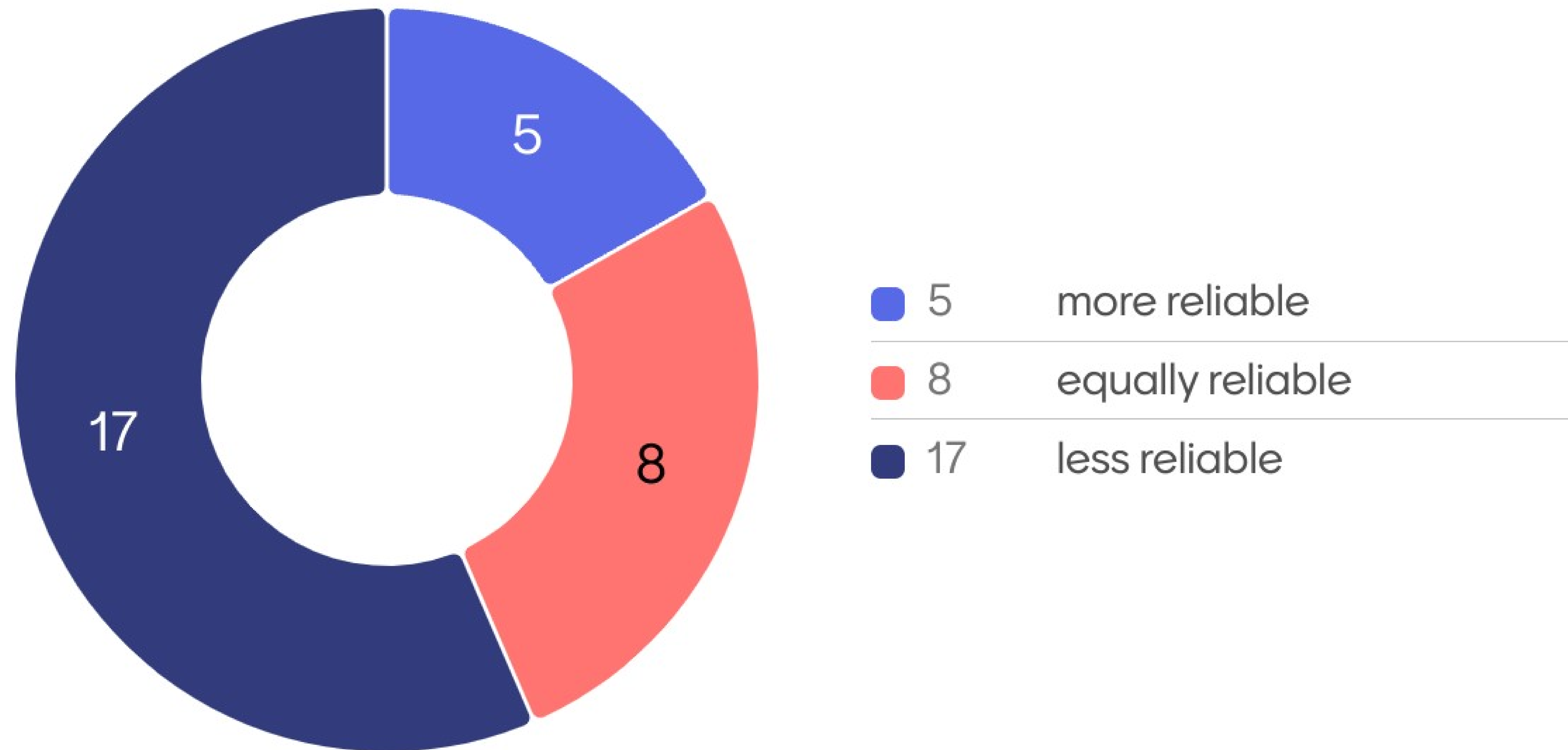
How do you believe AI impacts student engagement?




Have you observed changes in student performance due to the use of AI?
